

SONOMA COUNTY RELEASES EVACUATION ZONE MAPS FOR UNINCORPORATED AREAS

The County of Sonoma has released official evacuation zone maps designed to help residents be ready for an emergency that may require them to evacuate their homes.

The County is establishing standardized evacuation zones for Sonoma County. In the past, evacuation zones were different for each incident. Now zones will remain the same, and residents are urged to learn their evacuation zones and be ready to go when an evacuation order is issued. The maps show evacuation zones for unincorporated areas in Sonoma County as well as most of the incorporated communities.

“With wildfire season upon us, these official evacuation zone maps are an essential part of doing everything we can to make sure our families and neighbors are safe if disaster strikes,” said Supervisor Lynda Hopkins, Chair of the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors. “We all need to learn our zones and know what to do and where to go if our zone is ordered to evacuate.”

County emergency officials say that knowing your evacuation zone number is a key element of a disaster preparedness plan. Residents are urged to write down their zone number and consider learning the zones near their residence to help them better understand the level of risk to their property when an emergency arises. It also is important to know the evacuation zone where you work and where your children’s schools are.


During the Kincadee Fire in October 2019, for example, more than 190,000 residents in the County eventually were ordered to evacuate their homes. The Sheriff’s Office was nearly finished developing the evacuation zone maps when the Walbridge and Meyers fires hit in August 2020, followed by the Glass Fire a month later. The decision was made to release the draft maps at that time. Feedback from the community and first responders after those fires has been incorporated into the final, official evacuation zone maps referenced above. Evacuation zone numbers in unincorporated Sonoma County now have SON before the number.

To help first responders evacuate neighborhoods quickly and safely during a disaster, the Sheriff’s Office is giving away evacuation tags to residents living in unincorporated Sonoma County and its contract cities, Sonoma and Windsor. Residents are encouraged to place the tag in a location that is most visible to first responders who are on the street. This could be a gate, a mailbox, or a front door. If there is more than one home on the property, make sure all homes are evacuated before placing the tag near the street.

Residents also are urged to sign up for emergency alerts to ensure they receive critical updates, including evacuation alerts. Register at:

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VEGETATION MANAGEMENT FOR FIRE SAFETY

With fire season upon us, it is that time of year to consider home defense in the wildland urban interface environment. The Sonoma County Fire District has been actively conducting vegetation management inspections throughout the district, educating homeowners about defensible space around their property and specifically home hardening. While your firefighters work extremely hard protecting life and property during these



catastrophic events, the reality is that we can't be everywhere at once. Which is why we ask all homeowners to do their part in helping to protect their home in the event that the firefighters can't get there.

When we talk about home hardening, we are looking at six specific areas where homeowners can improve the survivability of their homes:

- 1) Roofs: keep gutters and roof valleys clear of combustible materials.
- 2) Eaves: enclose eaves to prevent ember intrusion.
- 3) Vents: install metal ember safe covers.
- 4) Walls and Fencing: build or remodel with noncombustible or ignition resistant materials when possible.
- 5) Windows and Doors: install weather proofing around your garage door. Use dual pane windows with tempered glass.
- 6) Balconies and Decks: Build with noncombustible materials and don't store combustibles underneath.

COUNTY REDISTRICTING MAY REDRAW DISTRICT LINES


Back in February, the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors established a 15-member commission that will assist the Board in redrawing supervisorial district boundaries using new Census data.

Every 10 years the United States Census Bureau conducts a nationwide census to enumerate the country's population. Under the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 and the California Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors must oversee the adjustment of supervisorial district boundaries within the County to reflect the new census data and keep supervisorial districts substantially equal in population. The 2020 Census data was initially due to be released on March 31 but, due to COVID-19-related delays, the Census information is not expected to be out until September. Formation of an Advisory Redistricting Commission and subsequent appointment of members to the commission will allow staff to prepare and train the commission and ensure that the County is ready to proceed once the 2020 Census data is released.

In addition to establishing the commission, the County of Sonoma will follow the California Elections Code requirements for extensive public outreach and adoption of the new district boundaries. The Board approved the use of \$130,000 for contracts to support the redistricting process, including facilitation and training services, interactive mapping technology, and translation and interpretation services. Public outreach will include public hearings, a media campaign, outreach to community groups including minority communities, live translation at meetings and creation of a website dedicated to redistricting: https://sonomacounty.ca.gov/_templates_portal/Project.aspx?id=2147590227.
