## WHAT TO EXPECT FROM YOUR NEW SHERIFF

Greetings, Larkfield and Mark West residents. I took office on January 2, 2023 as the 35th elected Sheriff of Sonoma County. I served with the Sheriff's Office for 20 years, starting as a patrol deputy and spending several years as a Domestic Violence/ Sexual Assault detective. I then began earning promotions up the ranks, ultimately serving as the Assistant Sheriff overseeing the Detention Division. I believe that everyone deserves to feel safe and everyone deserves fair treatment. To that end, I have three key goals I'm implementing with my staff:

- Public safety. The primary mission of the Sheriff's Office is keeping you safe. It may be easy for this message to get lost in conversations of budget cuts and the complex social issues we are all trying to solve. However, my number one priority is public safety. When you call 9-1-1, a dispatcher will answer your call and a deputy will show up to help you.
- Recruitment. I'm focused on hiring talented people who are more reflective of the community we serve. Like many businesses, the Sheriff's Office is experiencing a staffing

- shortage. We are currently at critical staffing levels, necessitating overtime to provide basic services. Patrol deputies have been working an emergency schedule (12 hour shifts) for well over a year and correctional deputies regularly work doubles (16 hour shifts). I added two additional background investigators to process the extensive background checks more quickly. I'm also contracting with a recruitment firm specializing in law enforcement.
- Community Engagement. Communication is key in maintaining a healthy, positive relationship with the Sheriff's Office and the people we serve. I'm focusing on two-way communication so the community understands how the Sheriff's Office provides services, and we understand the community's expectations and needs. I personally attend as many events as I can and I'm launching a series of Town Halls this year. The first Town Hall was held on February 23. The next Town Hall will be held in the Sonoma Valley in May. Follow the Sheriff's Office on social media (@sonomasheriff) for announcements of future Town Halls and events.

I cannot find success alone. Ensuring safe communities takes the cooperation of the Sheriff's Office and the community working together, in good times and in times of crisis. My entire staff and I appreciate the long-standing support and collaboration from the Mark West and Larkfield communities.

Five great prizes were awarded through the business card drawing this month:



#### **Right of Petition:**

Additional candidates may be nominated by petition, which must bear the signatures of at least ten (10) active members. Such petitions shall be filed with the judging committee by April 30th. The determination as to the legality of the petitions shall be supervised by the judging committee.

If no petition is filed within the designated period, the nominations will be closed, and a slate of candidates shall be elected at the regular May Board of Directors meeting.

If one or more legal petitions are received with additional candidates, the names of all candidates will be presented on a ballot in alphabetical order, and with instructions for voting for the correct number, shall be given to all members. Notice shall be given no later than ten (10) days prior to the May Board meeting. The ballots must be received by the Chamber office no later than 4PM the day before the May board meeting and at this meeting the Board of Directors will declare the candidates with the greatest number of votes elected.



Sonoma County residents can now receive live, free, 24/7 online tutoring and homework help in every K-12 subject with HelpNow by Brainfuse. This eResource joins dozens of other school resources offered by the Sonoma County Library.

"Students and parents in our communities are doing a lot of great learning out there, but the library knows they could use more expert help with homework. HelpNow by Brainfuse is a wonderful addition to Sonoma County Library's online study tools," said Rachel Icaza, Education Initiatives Librarian at the Sonoma County Library. "Students and parents can log in 24/7 to receive one-on-one homework help in English, Spanish and French!"

Brainfuse has provided supplemental educational services for more than 20 years, including online homework help, practice tests, study tools and collaborative tools. Students communicate with live tutors via the internet. Brainfuse offers assistance with math, science, language arts and other core K-12 subjects in English, Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese and Tagalog. 
#### Earn a High School Diploma, Free with Your Library Card
